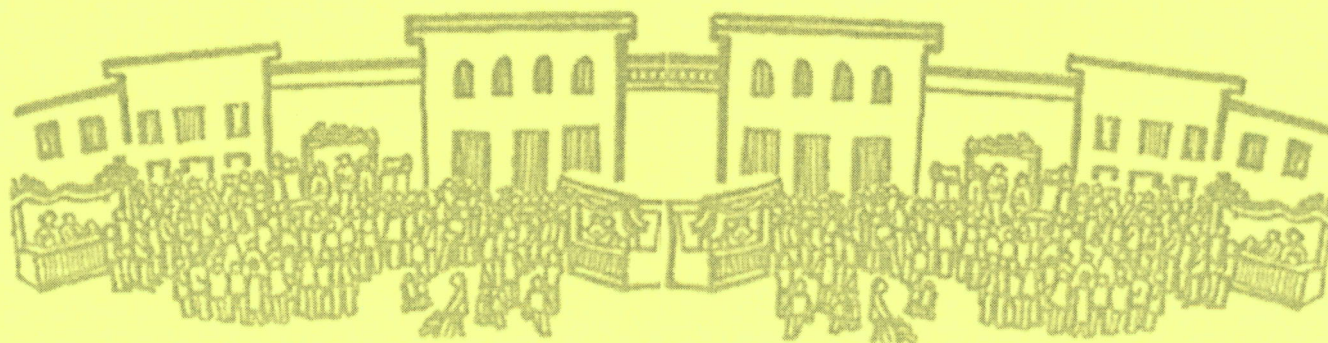

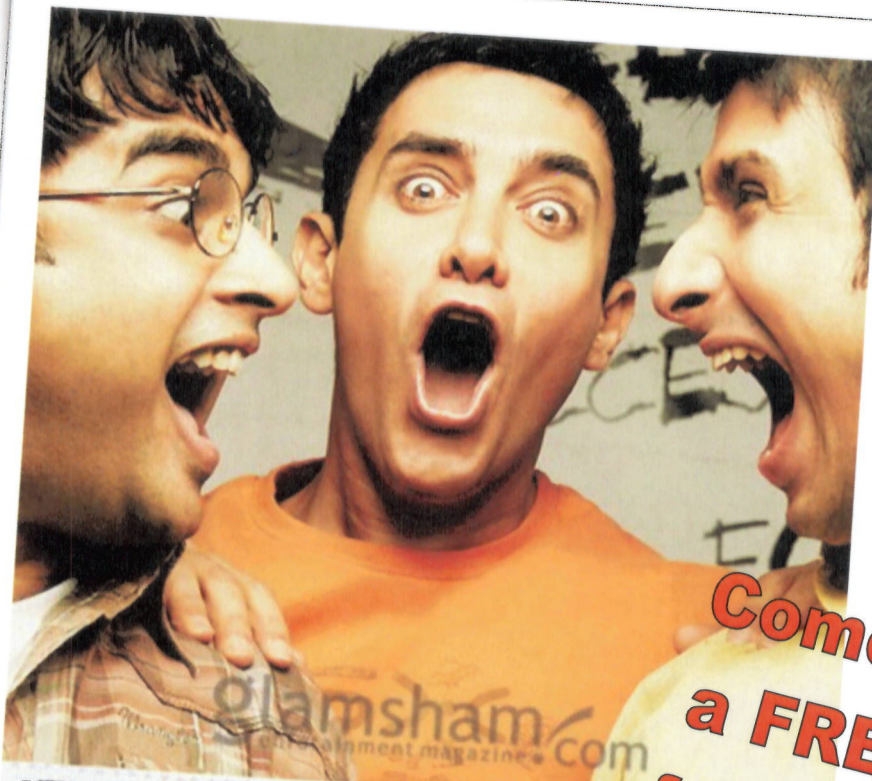

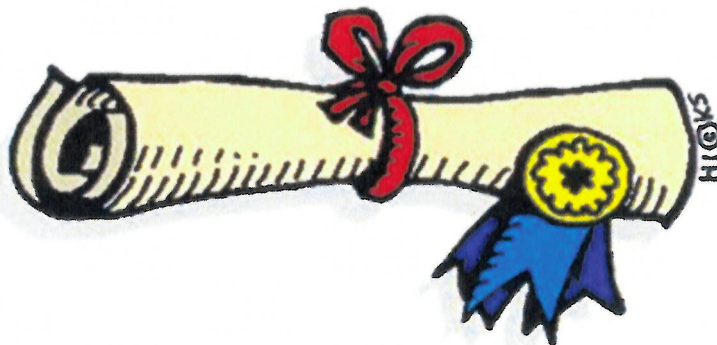

The U.S. Constitution has 4,440 words. It's the oldest and the shortest written constitution of any major government in the world.

Constitution day is celebrated on September 17, the anniversary of the day the framers signed the document

The oldest person to sign the Constitution was Benjamin Franklin (81). The youngest was Jonathan Dayton of New Jersey (26).

When the Constitution was signed, the United States' population was 4 million. It's now more than 312 million. Philadelphia was the nation's largest city, with 40,000 inhabitants.

George Washington and James Madison were the only presidents who signed the Constitution.

The word "democracy" does not appear once in the Constitution.

April 6, 1789: George Washington is elected the first President of the U.S. under the Constitution with 69 electoral votes. John Adams is elected Vice Pres. with 34 votes.

The first time the formal term "The United States of America" was used was in the Declaration of Independence.

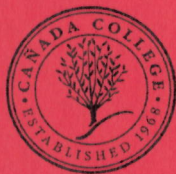
